

In British Open

TRON, Scotland (AP)—The 1962 British Open championship, one of the real prizes of golf, opened today in an atmosphere suggesting it was a match between the United States and Australia.

Palmer led a contingent of eight Americans into the championship as a 2-1 favorite to retain the crown he won last year at Birkdale in England. But he knew full well he had to contend with Phil Rodgers of La Jolla, Calif., who qualified with 142 against Palmer's 143, old Sam Snead, U. S. Open champion Jack Nicklaus and Gene Littler, the San Diego, Calif., star who won the U. S. Open a year ago.

Palmer and his American buddies were also looking over their shoulders at the Australians.

They were Kel Nagle, who won the 1960 title at St. Andrews, beating Palmer by one shot, Bruce Devlin, an amateur turned professional who was the key to Australia's defeat of the United States in the Eisenhower World Cup play at St. Andrews in 1959, and the reliable Peter Thomson, four times British Open King.
